

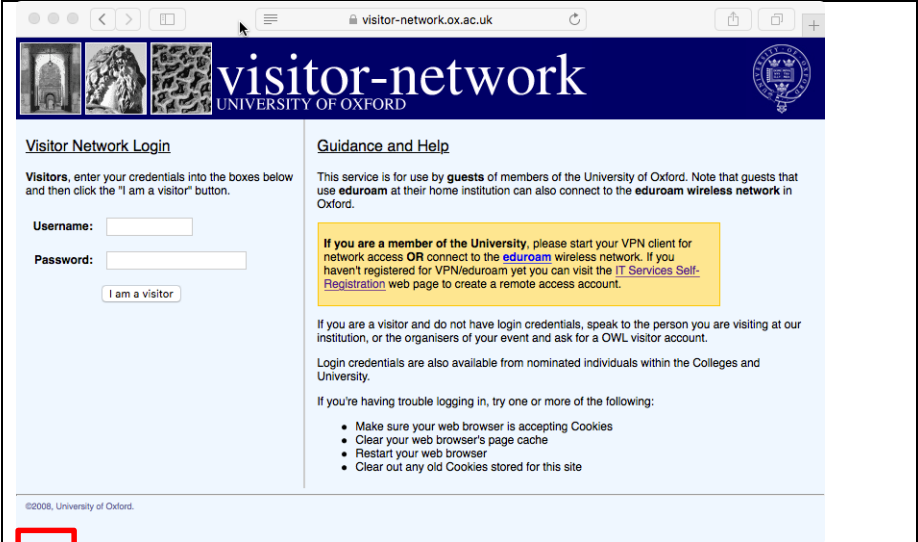
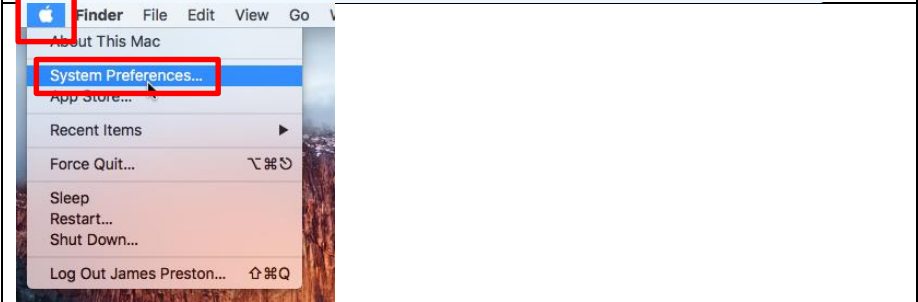
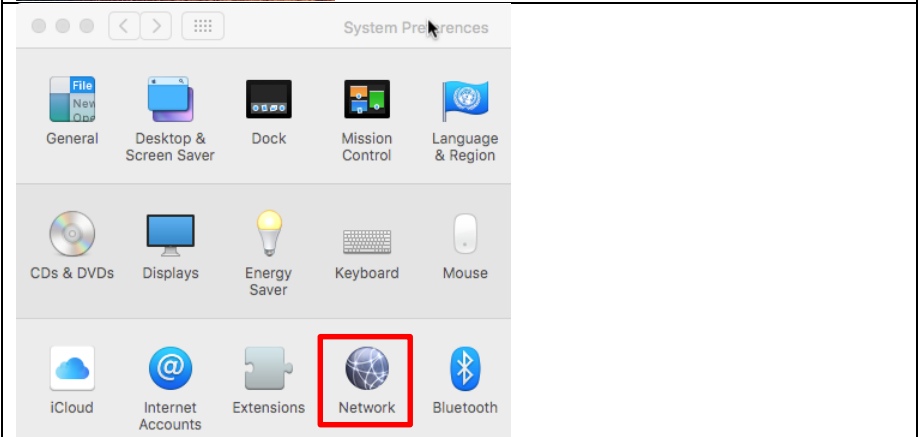
Wired Network Access – OSX

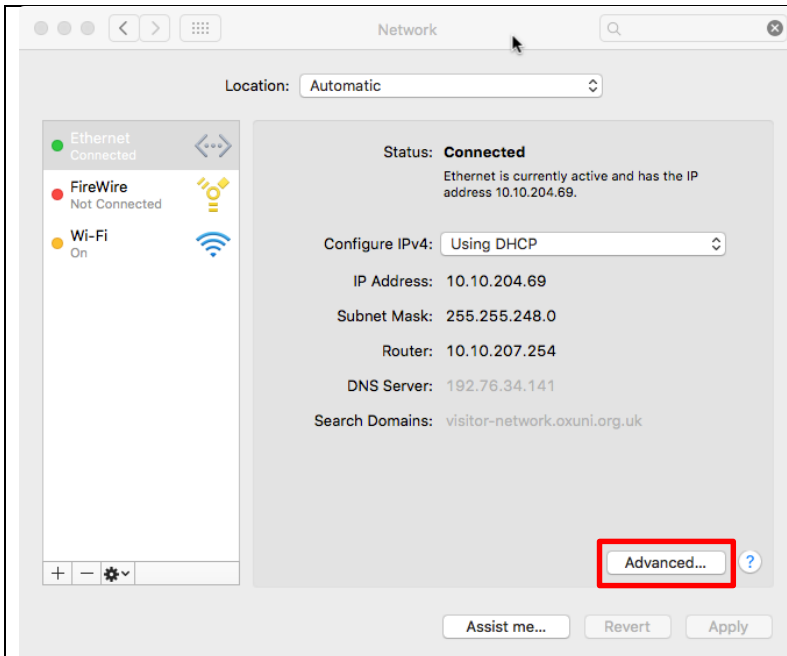

Prerequisites

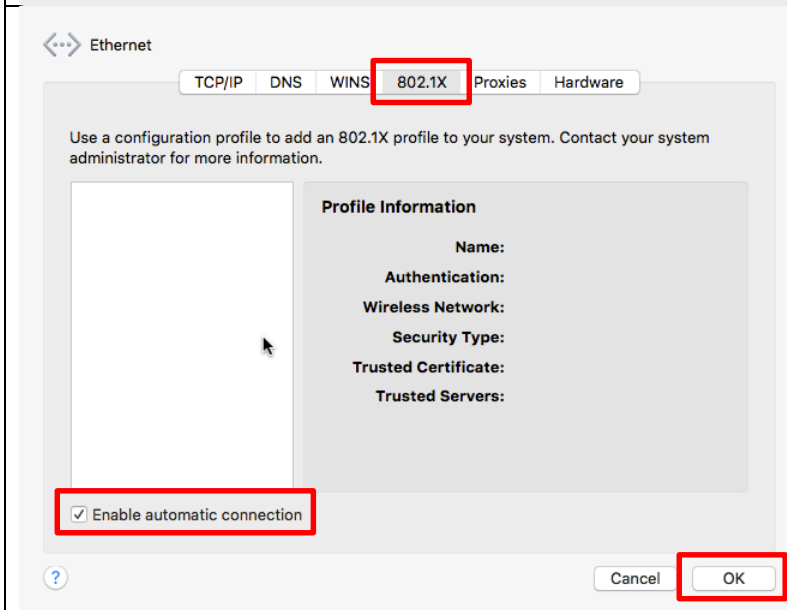
Your computer must have a wired network port (or via adapter) and you must have valid Remote Access user account details. If you are unsure about your Remote Access user account details contact the IT Office (it-support@queens.ox.ac.uk or 01865 279205).

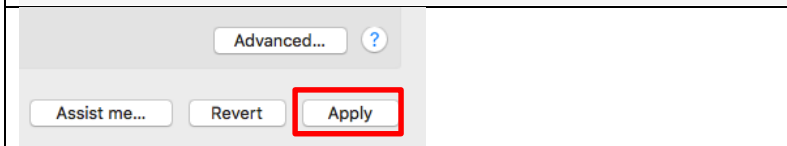
	<p>If you haven't done so already plug in the network cable – after a short wait the OWL Visitor page will appear in Safari.</p>
	<p>To actually gain access to the internet head to the Apple Icon and click System Preferences.</p>
	<p>From the window that appears click Network.</p>



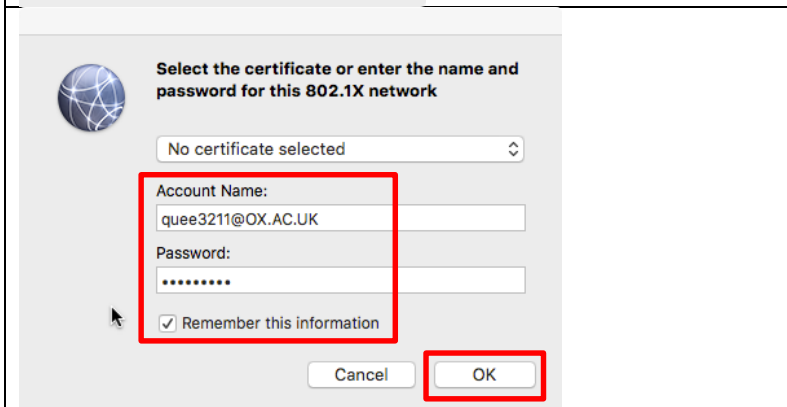
Click **Advanced**.



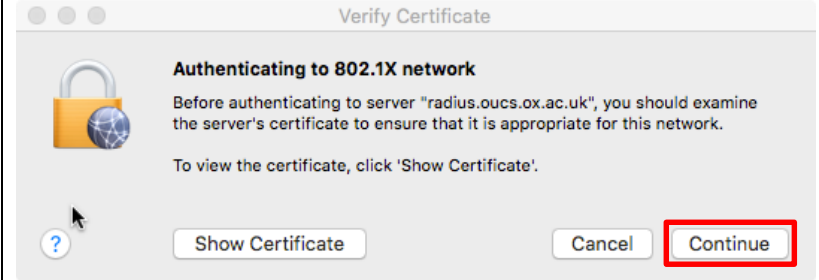
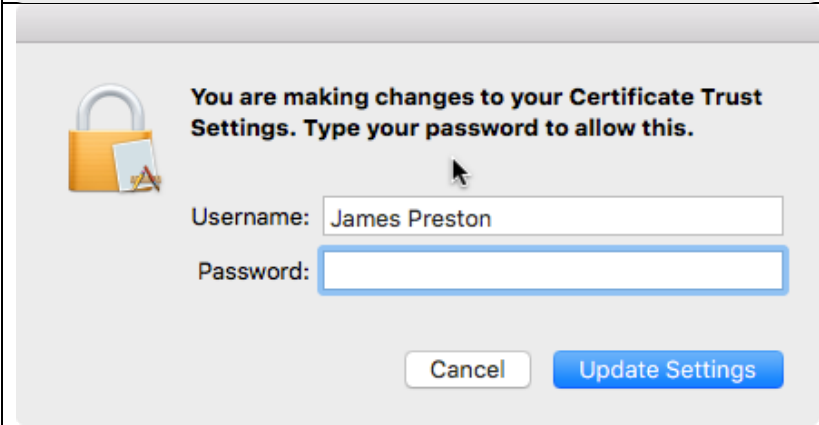
Select **802.1x** and tick the **Enable automatic connection** option. Click **OK**.



Click **Apply**.



After a short wait a prompt will appear, **enter your remote access details** (ensuring that you use @OX.AC.UK at the end of your username) and **tick the Remember this information box**. Click **OK**.
